Everyone Forever can be a tool for communities to transform and thrive independently long into the future."

Summer is an active volunteer with the Arizona Water Association Water For People Committee, serving as event organizer for the Pints for People event and also helping orchestrate the Wine into Water fundraiser. Over the past five years, Summer has been an integral part of making the event a success. Her contributions include coordinating with event venues, ordering merchandise for the events, and soliciting donations for the silent auctions. Summer brings positive energy and detailed organization to every event, helping to make them huge successes.

"Growing up in Arizona, I was always acutely aware of the effort it takes to get water to our homes. We relied on well water, and my parents were mindful of our usage – limiting showers and repurposing washing machine water to irrigate the fruit trees in our backyard. I've also seen firsthand the lengths the U.S. government goes to in order to provide water to the Navajo people, who live in the Four Corners region of our state. My company, Archer Western Construction, is one of several contractors working on the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project. For many Navajo families, access to water is a major challenge, with many driving long distances just to haul it back to their homes.

That's why organizations like Water For People are so vital. Their work helps provide water to communities in countries without the same infrastructure or government support, alleviating the burden on women and children who often bear the responsibility of fetching water – time that could otherwise be spent on education or work."
